IAM Legislative Conference in Washington DC

The 2025 IAM Legislative Conference was held in Washington DC, from April 29th to May 1st. Delegates went to the Senate and Representative offices to make their voices heard. We joined a rally at Columbus Circle, outside Union Station to support our Brothers and Sisters of the National Federation of Federal Employees (NFFE). Event speakers included Representative Jamie Raskin, Congressman Steny Hoyer, Senator Van Hollen, Representative Glen Ivey, R Sydney Kamlager-Dove, as well as IAM International President, Brian Bryant, and the Executive Council and NFFE-IAM President Randy Irwin.

Ernie Domnie, Leah Smerud, and I visited Representative Derrick Van Orden, as well as Tammy Baldwin and Ron Johnson's offices for Wisconsin, and Angie Craig for Minnesota. We stressed the importance of keeping Collective Bargaining Rights for EVERYONE. Right now, the attack is on the Federal workers, but it won't be long before they come for everyone else's. An attack on one is an attack on all workers. We spoke on the impacts of the recent stream of Presidential Executive Orders, and how many will negatively impact daily lives for millions of people in the USA. Veterans, children, single parents, and the list goes on. We spoke of the need to support manufacturing in America. People want to work, but they need to earn a livable wage. Healthcare costs are burdensome to the Company, as well as the employee, which leaves less for other basic life necessities.
